

Enrollment Highlights


- There are 1,086 undergraduate students enrolled in the major in Economics in the College
 of Arts and Sciences (917) and the concentration in Economics in the Carroll School of
 Management (169), which again makes Economics the largest major and concentration
 and the largest ever recorded.
- There are 384 students enrolled in Freshman Topic Seminars, which is its largest recorded enrollment
- The number of students majoring in Computer Science has more than doubled over the past ten years, while the number of students majoring in Mathematics has risen over 50 percent.
- There are 345 graduate students enrolled in the **School of Theology and Ministry**, which is its largest recorded enrollment.
- * Undergraduate enrollment includes 360 students on Boston College **International Exchange** programs.
- The following **undergraduate majors** and concentrations are at a 30-year high: Biochemistry (270), Biology (865), Chemistry (160), Economics (1,086), and Finance (938).
- Finance is again the largest concentration ever recorded in the Carroll School of Management.
- Undergraduate enrollment from the following states has risen at least 30 percent over the past 15 years: Arizona, California, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Washington.






Undergraduate Majors and Minors with the Largest Enrollment



GRADUATION HIGHLIGHTS

- In the College of Arts and Sciences, 56 students graduated with a major in Biochemistry, 18 students graduated with a major in Physics, and 14 students graduated with a major in Linguistics, which is the largest recorded number of graduates in these disciplines.
- In the Carroll School of Management, 318 students graduated with two or three concentrations or majors, which is the largest recorded number of students in the Carroll School completing two or three concentrations or majors.
- The five largest majors and concentrations at graduation were: Finance (290), Economics (261), Communications (254), English (200), and Psychology (194).
- The College of Arts and Sciences awarded 330 Bachelor of Science degrees, the highest number recorded.
- Thirty-nine percent of full-time undergraduate students completed a minor.
- Sixty-five (65) students completed accelerated degree programs to earn an undergraduate and a graduate degree.
- 109 degrees were awarded to students pursuing dual degree programs at the graduate level.
